





# DREAMBATHROOM

Interiors stylist Milly Goodwin combines chalky textures and natural materials with lavish touches in this light yet luxurious scheme



### Can you describe the space?

It's in a traditional Georgian farmhouse in the Cotswolds. The previous owners had made some dramatic alterations that involved vaulting the first floor

to the rafters, losing an entire storey at the top of the house in the process. My clients decided to put the ceiling on the first floor back to its original height, and returned the top floor to attic bedrooms. As they were essentially starting from scratch with the layout, they could create rooms with more generous proportions and, at 6x3m, this master en-suite bathroom was no exception.

### What were the owners' requirements?

The overall brief was to create a pared-back classic country look that would suit the property's Georgian origins, in a neutral palette that would be elegant and timeless. The couple asked for a spacious double shower, as well as a generous bath, positioned to make the most of the glorious garden views.

### How did you source the main fittings?

Drummonds is my go-to supplier for period fittings. The owners had already decided on the company's heated towel rail, so then it was just a case of choosing fittings to match. All the brassware has a soft nickel finish, which is subtler than chrome and better suited to a neutrally toned scheme.

### What influenced the choice of materials?

I love using natural materials in their rawest state where possible, which is what we've aimed for here. They are brilliant for lifting a neutral palette and also suit the country feel. We chose a chalky paint, Pavilion Gray Estate Emulsion by Farrow & Ball, for the walls, and rough-hewn natural oak flooring. The wet areas are clad in a tactile honed limestone from Fired Earth.

# Can you tell us about the design of the double shower area?

The owners often leave the house at the same time, so requested a double walk-in shower

that would prevent gridlock in the mornings. The half wall is designed to give an element of privacy, and solves our concerns that an expanse of glass would feel too cold for the room. The limestone tiled wall helps integrate the large shower area into the room, and enhances the sense of symmetry.

### How did you dress the space?

The smart sash window is an original Georgian feature and deserved to be framed elegantly. We chose an unfussy silk-lined linen blind, with a sheer panel behind to provide a feeling of layered luxury and privacy. The chandelier was sourced by the owners and imported from America. Not only is the crystal beautifully decorative, but it also helps to centre the room, bringing the main elements together.

### What is the key to this room's success?

The combination of natural textures and high-quality fittings breathes life into an otherwise plain, neutral palette.
