Two years ago Drummonds, the British company known around the world for its luxurious bathroom ware, began working with Martin Brudnizki, the acclaimed interior architect behind The Ivy, Scott's and Soho Beach House Miami, who also runs his own product-design studio, And Objects. With his contemporary approach to classic design, incorporating modern technology and an appreciation of traditional craft methods, Brudnizki was the perfect match for the company, which since 1988 has been renowned for its matchless products – from sleek enamelled tubs and gleaming brass taps to hand-glazed basins.

Drummonds was established with the aim of keeping alive the increasingly rare art of making beautiful bathroom pieces by hand in iron, brass and clay. Each of its products is crafted using time-honoured processes to ensure incomparable quality. Every one of its cast-iron tubs, for instance, is hand-finished, taking several weeks to complete. The company's sanitary ware is moulded in fine English china clay, valued for its durability, which is mixed in small batches to guarantee consistency before being fired in the kiln. Every item of brassware is shaped

in wax before being cast (an ancient technique known as the lost-wax process), which means not a single sculpted detail is lost in the finished product.

Brudnizki and Drummonds have collaborated on an inspirational collection of bathroom wares and accessories. From lights to mirrors, hooks to basins and tubs, each piece combines an engineer's rigorous sense of functionality with an artist's appreciation of form.

Now, Drummonds is proud to announce the introduction of new pieces to the Martin Brudnizki collection: the exquisite 'Leawood' range of taps and showers. Brudnizki's conception of the collection was as much ergonomically driven as aesthetically. It was an approach that led him to designing the smooth, curved shapes and simple, modern lines of 'Leawood', perfectly realised through the lost-wax casting process. Working with Drummonds's brassware craftsmen from the project's start to its finish, Brudnizki was able to create an exciting fusion of simple, modern lines, with the weight and detail afforded by this historic technique.

'Leawood' completes the current collection by Martin Brudnizki for Drummonds. But the partnership isn't over yet; he is currently designing the company's brand-new showroom in New York, and other products are on the horizon ■ Drummonds, 642 King's Road, London SW6 (020 7376 4499; drummonds-uk.com)
