FOOTBALL MATCH **PROGRAMMES**

If you're clearing cupboards this winter, keep an eye out for football ephemera. Old football programmes, in particular, can be highly collectable, especially those relating to tours or friendly matches. Given a pre-sale estimate of £600-£800, a much-fancied official souvenir programme from Manchester United's 1952 Canadian tour match against Montreal All Stars at Delorimier Stadium, Quebec on 13th May, made £7,190. While a Belfast Celtic v Glasgow Celtic programme for a game played in Belfast on 27th April, 1925, made £2,970 against an estimate of £650-£750.
